HTA Rep Council Minutes

President Jim Brigham called the meeting to order at 4:06 pm.

The promptness prize went to Jennifer Baranau.

The minutes of the October meeting were approved as read. Motion by Evelyn Kight Moore, seconded by Alyssa King.

President's report:

Jim reported that he has sent a demand to bargain letter to LaFaye since the district has received an increase in Base Revenue money and Federal Jobs Act money.

Two proposed calendars for 2011-12 were presented. Rep council asked Jim to get attendance data for past December's for the December meeting, to help decide which calendar would be the best.

Evaluations: If it is not an evaluation year you do not need to write goals and objectives.

An accounting of how the PAC money was spent on the school board election was handed out.

Cabinet Report:

Jobs Bill/ Budget: HTA has demand to bargain letter in. HUSD wants to bank the money until next year.

RSP: Sally said the district is looking into how many special ed students are in general ed classes and vice versa.

Problem Schools: Sally said that she is working with Principal's on a climate goal to help turn around the suspension rate.

Walk Throughs: Some administrators are using technology and forms as they a doing the walk throughs.

Autism Certificate: All mild to moderate autism teachers will be trained by the district by 2013.

6th period subbing: You will only be compensated for 20 hours of subbing, unless HR as approved it. It is the Principal and teachers job to keep track of the hours.

Athletic Director: Job descriptions need to be written for them as well as coaches.

Data Director: It is designed as a tool for teachers. Teachers should use it as a self - evaluation.

School Services Presentation: The superintendent has invited HTA to send one person to this conference to hear their side of the budget.

State Council: The longevity bonus sunsets December 31, 2010. Everyone should do whatever he or she can do to get his or her 30 years in.

New Business:

Motion passed. The motion to table the issue of furlough days passed.

Alyssa King made a motion to increase the PAC by \$ 726.58, seconded by Michael Swain. Motion passed.
